In your room you will discover a food and water bowl with floor mat, special pet treats and pet beds and a doggy throw (to cover the sofa with, should that be your pet's preferred sleeping place!

We do ask, however, that you adhere to the following rules:

- You must notify us in advance that your dog will be accompanying you and let us know whether you require a kennel for him or prefer to have him sleep in your room with you
- Your dog must be kept on a leash when in the hotel or on hotel property unless it is in the guest room
- Pets must not be left unattended
- Pets are not allowed in our food and beverage areas and pool areas of the hotel - This exclusion does not apply to guide dogs.
- Guests are responsible for cleaning up after their own dog
- Any disturbances such as barking must be curtailed to ensure other guests are not inconvenienced
- Should your dog soil in the bedroom there will be a fixed charge of €100.00
- The hotel reserves the right to charge guest's account appropriate to the cost of such damages.
- Please do not enter any fields where there are cattle and horses
- Wet dogs are not permitted in the hotel – Please insure your dog is clean and dry before entering the hotel (a doggy towel will be provided with your welcome pack)
- We expect that you will be responsible with your dog, as you do know your dog best!
